The Twelve Traditions Of Sex Addicts Anonymous

- 1. Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon such SAA unity.
- 2. For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority-a loving God as expressed in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.
- 3. The only requirement for SAA membership is a desire to stop compulsive sexual behavior.
- 4. Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups of SAA as a whole.
- 5. Each group has but one purpose to carry its message to others who still suffer.
- 6. An SAA group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the SAA name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property, and prestige divert us from our primary purpose.
- 7. Every SAA group ought to be self-supporting, declining outside contributions.
- 8. Sex Addicts Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.
- 9. SAA as such, ought never be organized; but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.
- 10. Sex Addicts Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the SAA name ought never be drawn into public controversy.
- Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, TV and films.
- 12. Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.
